---

**Trivia Question: What was the date of Dr. Bobs last drink?**

**1971**

Jan 24, 1971 Bill W dies at the age of 75. On Feb 14, groups around the world hold memorial meetings honoring Bill's work as co-founder of A.A., author of the Big Book along with the architect and articulator of the Fellowship's principles.

**1973**

The Big Book distribution reaches one million. The one millionth copy is presented to President Richard Nixon in a ceremony at the White House.

**1975**

Living Sober is published. This was a book of members experiences that describes methods of living without drinking. The material for the book was gathered in the early 1970s from groups and individual correspondence of shared experience, then writers compiled it into a book.

**1975**

A.A. archives opens at the general service office. In November 1975 Lois W and Tom S from Jacksonville FL a trustee who chairs the archives committee cut the blue ribbon to officially open AA archives at GSO in New York. Play in a brief speech doctor John L Norris points out that a must continually renew itself by going back to its source recalling Bill W's frequent request that the board and the dogs so should put everything they do on record. The archivist is non alcoholic Neal Wing who served as Bill's secretary for many years and is described as one woman walking encyclopedia of a lore.

**1976**

Third edition of the big book published in 1976. 13 new stories appear in the third edition of Alcoholics Anonymous. By the summer of 1976 more than 1,450,000 copies of the big book first two editions have been distributed world wide.

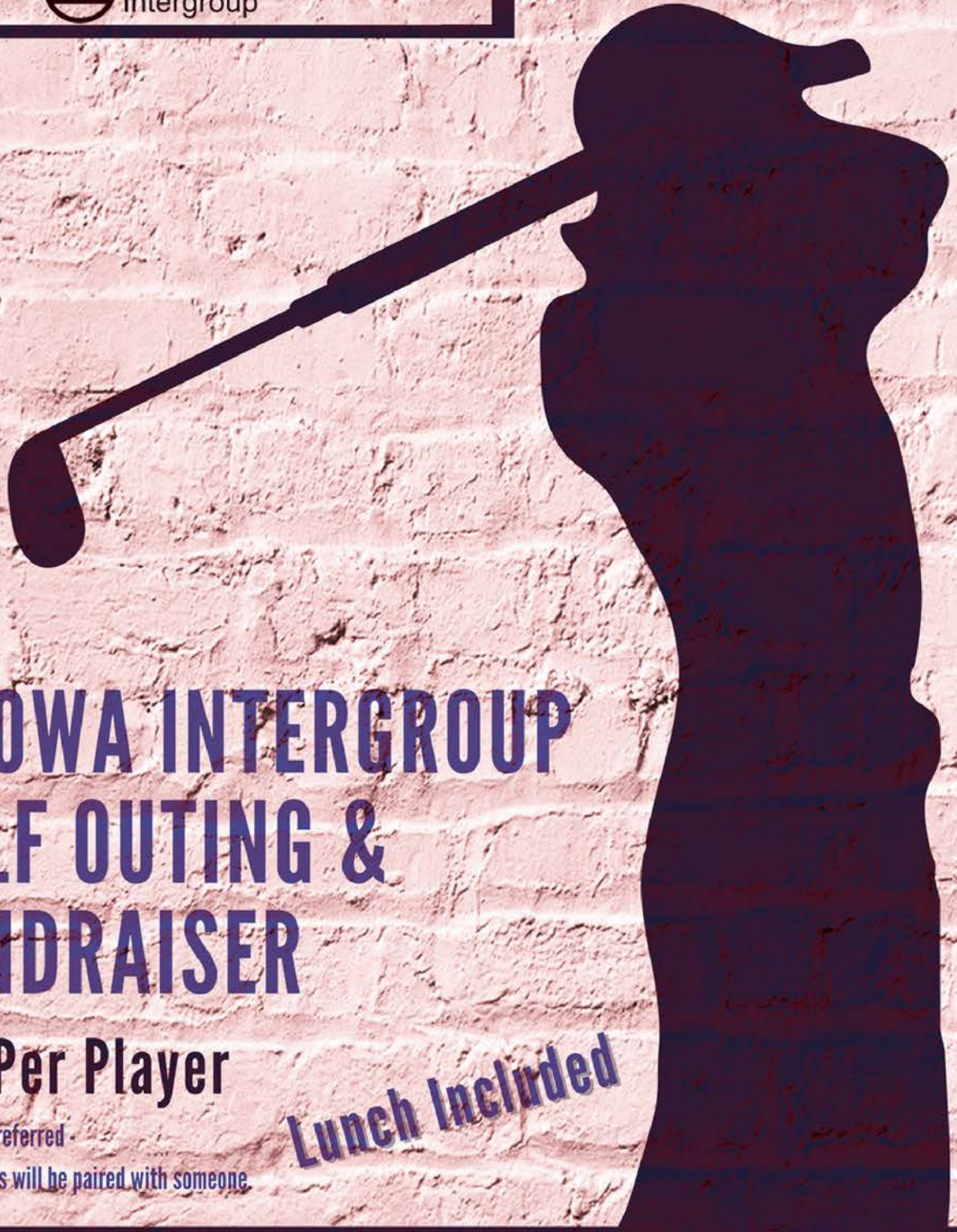
