Greeting the Millennium - In 2000 47,000 people celebrate the Freedom from Bondage in Minneapolis. One of the memorable events was Walk the Walk, in which a stream of attendees from 86 nations walks the blue line laid down from the Convention Center to the Hubert Humphrey Metrodome on their way to the opening ceremony.

2000 AL-ANONS FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

Forty-three years after its founding, Al-Anon holds its first international convention.

2001 - First Woman Charis General Service Board - In 2001, a woman is elected to chair the General Service Board for the first time: Elaine McDowell, Ph.D. She served as a Class A(nonalcoholic) trustee for nine years. She brought 28 years of experience in the prevention and treatment field as well as abiding faith in A.A.'s basic principles.

2001 - A.A. At Ground Zero - In the wake of the September 11,2001 attack on the World Trade Center in New York, exhausted A.A. members among firefighters, police, and clean-up crews realize the need for A.A. meetings near Ground Zero. The rooms become places where A.A.s can not only meet but also rest.

2001 - The Big Book's Fourth Edition - In November 2001, a new edition of the Big Book – the culmination of four years of development and 25 -plus committee meetings – rolls of the press. While the first 164 pages remain unchanged, the new edition includes the stories of 41 sober alcoholics (24 new stories and 17 “keepers” from the third edition).
