If all goes well with getting the new meetings started, I plan to reach out to 605 Main this month to discuss their needs and how we might be able to bring the message of AA recovery to their residents. Another goal in the coming weeks is to reach out to all District 9 group corrections liaisons. I want to find a way to get them active in their positions. I attended the West Central Regional Forum on Friday and Saturday, March 3 & 4th via Zoom and will be attending the Area 24 service weekend in Marshalltown on March 22 nd .
