

### District 9 Meeting Minutes June 1, 2025

<u>DCM-</u> Greeting district! I don't have much to report this month. I will be attending the spring conference in Clear Lake IA. If there is anything I can do for you or if you have questions, please don't hesitate to reach out.

Alt DCM- Greetings District 9,

The Webmaster reported that there were 4,089 visitors to the Illowa site in April. 1,408 were on the site for more than 30 seconds, which is on track with our average of 1,400 visits per month. The Meeting Page is still the most visited page on aaquadcities.org, followed by the Flyer Page. The Virtual Page came in 3rd and the Calendar Page was the 4th most visited page in April. There was a spike in visits was on the April 15th. The annual website renewal cost of \$163.02 was split three ways, between Intergroup, District 9 and District 90.

In May the website had 5,308 visitors, of which 1,290 were on the site for more than 30 seconds. This is slightly below the average of 1,400. The Meeting Page was still the most visited page, followed by the Flyer Page. Just like April, the Virtual Page came in 3rd and the Calendar Page was the 4th most visited page. In an interesting note; the month of May had 2 spikes in visits! One on May 7th and the other on May 15th. As always, please check the Flyers page for all Group Announcements.

We preserve our history protecting our early history, stories of longtime members and key events, guiding future generations in their understanding of AA's principles and how they were lived out over time."
