DCM- Hello District 9! I hope everyone has had a great August – I am sorry to see the summer go but on to my birthday month! I attended the Area 24 Business Meeting on August 10th.. Unfortunately, I sent my district 9 report to the wrong email address, and it was not in the monthly newsletter for those of you who got that. My sincere apologies. I try to inform the area of what each chair is doing in the district, but I am only allowed 2. minutes and let me tell you, that is not long! The meeting started out much about finances as the area was down to a bank balance of 2914.98 which was not enough to cover everyone to travel. After the checks were opened it was determined that there will be enough funds, but area is running on a tight budget right now. GSO is working remotely right now due to renovation on the 11th floor for about 10-12 weeks. The west central regional forum will have zero cost to register but there will be no hybrid option, and it will be held in Omaha Neb. The upcoming conferences will be: Fall Oct 2025 Fort Dodge IA, Marshalltown June Spring 2026 , Oct Fall 2026 Cedar Falls. <u>Archives-</u> Hello District Chairs, GSRs. September 7, 2025, District 9 Archives Report – Group Info was turned into Area 24 for Sisters in Sobriety and meeting information for W.E.T.W.O. which is a women's meeting that meets at the Abbey Treatment Center. I filed hard copies in the filing cabinet for the group events for August and started moving the online archives to the filing cabinet and saving on flash drives. I am still working on inventory. I attended the 8th Annual Overdose and Addiction Awareness Vigil in Clinton. The theme was "No Wrong Ways, Different Pathways" highlights that every road to recovery doesn't follow the same path. The Clinton County Sheriff provided food and drinks and there were tents with approximately 15 different agencies with over 260 people in attendance supporting persons in recovery. A speaker that worked in the court system

talked of a local man that died during an improper detox from alcohol and reminded the crowd alcohol detox should be done through a medical facility. Another local resident that was known for years as an alcoholic but at the end of his life he was sober more than he was drunk. I have never seen an event this size for people in recovery in this area. He states as a member with 42 years of sobriety he goes to a meeting every day. He also mentioned Bill Wilson, Carl Jung and Dr. Silkworth. 


