I attended the Celebration of Life for long-time AA member Joanne R. Many spoke of her applying the principles in her life and attitude. There were several people there who had been sponsored by Joanne. One of my favorite quotes was, "She (Joanne) would tell me not to put on my future boots." Remembering Joanne's strong spirit and sharing happy memories really was evidence that Alcoholics Anonymous' celebrations of life are full of spiritual ties to each other and the program. I felt like I was sitting in a past world and a current world, and I couldn't help but think Joanne was in a different world at the same time, experiencing the same with us. The event I found was very healing, grounding, and spiritual. During my inventory of archives, I found a copy of a letter addressed to an AA member living in Spencer, IA. It was a transcript from GSO of letters sent from Ray H (founder of AA in Iowa) to GSO. I want to share when he mentioned Davenport. A letter from Ray H. on June 21, 1944, reveals another new group meeting in Newton, IA. The secretary is Dr. E.A.M. There were three members, but the meeting itself had 34; 16 from Des Moines, 6 from Marshalltown, 8 from Cedar Rapids, 1 from Grinnell, and 3 from Newton. The letter also mentioned Davenport having regular weekly meetings, but them not having gone there to visit yet. Ray concludes the letter by saying, "Newton was No. 6 for Iowa, Davenport is No. 7". I was amazed at how members of groups were driving quite a way to support new groups. This was during a high-growth time. Today, it could be said AA is in a low-to-no growth time. Grapevine podcast "Brown Bagger[Season 10, Episode 15] David, Punxsutawney PA, His group put on a Big Book Conference, and it was poorly attended. He thought people were misinterpreting Tradition 4 that says "every group should be autonomous" as meaning not supporting or looking out for their neighboring groups. In this time of low to no growth, I would like to ask the question, should we be exerting the same energy Ray H and the founders had. 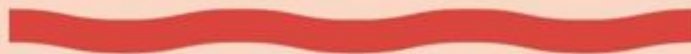
